Dr. Barbara Sorrels is an early childhood specialist, educator, and consultant with a heart for “children from hard places.” She is the founder of Connected Kids, a nonprofit which provides parents and guardians with compassionate, evidence-based strategies for guiding children through trauma and other challenges.

Her approach is based on the belief that when children feel connected to themselves, their families and the world around them, they can overcome even the darkest of circumstances to reach their fullest potential.

Prior to founding Connected Kids, Dr. Sorrels spent more than 20 years in education as a classroom teacher, a founder/director of early childhood centers in Washington, D.C. and Fort Worth, Texas, and a professor of graduate and undergraduate studies in the Early Childhood Education program at Oklahoma State University.

In 2007, Dr. Sorrels founded The Institute for Childhood Education to provide consulting and professional development training for educators and professionals from state agencies, school districts, child care centers and other child advocacy organizations.

Dr. Sorrels holds a doctorate in Early Childhood Education from Oklahoma State University, a master’s degree in Christian Education from Southwestern Seminary, and a bachelor’s degree from the University of Maryland. She lives in the Tulsa area with her husband, Bob, and is a proud mother and grandmother.

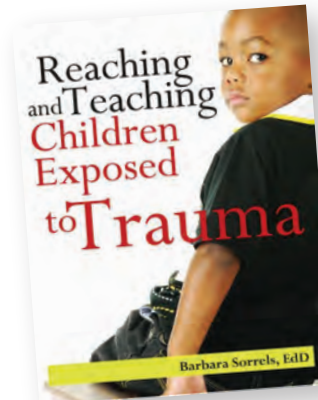

OUR PROGRAM

Increasing numbers of children in our country are exposed to various forms of maltreatment and trauma including physical and emotional neglect and abuse, sexual abuse, divorce and abandonment. These children are often identified as having special needs and most eventually receive the diagnosis of at least one of the following: ADD/ADHD, oppositional defiant, bipolar, obsessive compulsive disorder or depression.

It has been generally assumed that only those with advanced education and clinical skills can help traumatized children, but there is increasing evidence that teachers are a critical part of the process of healing. (Bath, 2008). Dr. Bruce Perry, a leading expert in trauma, recognizes that it is the ongoing, daily interactions with loving, emotionally responsive and caring adults that bring about healing.

This course is designed to equip educators with practical strategies that promote healing in order to reach and teach children exposed to trauma.
